#### Chronic (38 CFR 3.309(a))

- Lupus erythematosus, systemic
- Tuberculosis, active (3 years)
- Disease must manifest to a compensable degree within the applicable time limits under 38 CFR 3.307.

### Tropical (38 CFR 3.309 (b))

- Amebiasis
- Blackwater fever
- Cholera
- Dracontiasis
- Dysentery
- Filariasis
- Leishmaniasis, including kala-azar

- Malaria
- Onchocerciasis
- Orova fever
- Pinta (evaluate under skin, 38 CFR 4.118)
- Plague
- Schistosomiasis
- Yaws
- Yellow fever

malnutrition)

- Resultant disorders or diseases originating because of therapy administered in connection with such diseases or as a preventative thereof
- Disease must manifest to a compensable degree within the applicable time limits under 38 CFR 3.307 or 3.308.

# Former Prisoners of War (FPOW) (38 CFR 3.309(c))

- Avitaminosis
- Berberi (including berberi heart disease)
- Chronic dysentery
- Helminthiasis
- If the Veteran was interned or detained for not less than 30 days, the disease must manifest to a degree of 10 percent or more at any time after separation from service as defined by 38 CFR 3.307(a)(5).

### Persian Gulf Veterans (38 CFR 3.317)

Undiagnosed illness and medically unexplained chronic multisymptom illness (MUCMI) (38 CFR 3.317a-b)

- Undiagnosed illness
  - See also 3.317(b) for signs and symptoms
- Medically unexplained chronic multisymptom illness (MUCMI) that is defined by a cluster of signs and symptoms, such as

Malnutrition (including optic atrophy associated with

- Chronic fatigue syndrome
- Fibromylagia

Any other nutritional deficiency

- Irritable bowel syndrome (IBS)(a functional gastrointestinal disorder)
- See also 3.317(b) for signs and symptoms
- Disease must have manifested to a compensable degree not later than December 31, 2021.

## Infectious diseases (38 CFR 3.317(c))

- Brucellosis
- Campylobacter jejuni
- Coxiella burnetii (Q fever)
- Malaria
- Mycobacterium tuberculosis

- Nontyphoid Salmonella
- Shigella
- Visceral leishmaniasis
- West Nile virus
- Consider long-term health effects potentially associated with infectious diseases (see 38 CFR 3.317(d))
- Disease must manifest to a compensable degree within the applicable time limits under 38 CFR 3.317(c)(3)(i) and (ii).
