Tuition Assistance (TA) benefits began in the 1950s, as a way to provide education benefits to Servicemembers on active duty and were:	EMPHASIZE that TA assistance was part of the military services and was for active duty personnel, where the VA educational benefits were for Veterans.
 Paid by the military services Only 75% of cost VA benefits: Originally were only paid Veterans Could not pay for the same course that TA paid 	HIGHLIGHT that prior to Public Law 106- 398, the services could only pay 75% of the cost of a course, and that the VA could pay any benefits for the same course for which TA was paid.
TA Purpose	DISPLAY slide 6 "TA Purpose"
TA programs offer eligible Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, Coast Guard, National Guard, and Reserve members' 100% tuition for voluntary educational courses taken during off-duty hours in support of professional and personal self-development goals.	EMPHASIZE that TA program benefits are typically not restricted to Servicemembers pursuing college degrees, but may also be used by those looking to take the General Educational Development (GED) tests and earn their high school equivalency diploma or other qualified certificate programs.

Servicemembers are entitled to receive reimbursement for the full "out-of-pocket" charges. This is the amount the SCO will report.

 Claimants are charged one month of entitlement when the amount paid equals the full time monthly rate including any MGIB buy-up amount and college fund payment. Entitlement is pro-rated for lesser payments. By law, VA cannot pay for classes that began prior to the effective date of the legislation (10-30-00) and VA cannot pay for classes which ended more than one year prior to the date VA received the request for reimbursement and the formal claim for benefits is established.
