Board Remand

REMANDED

Service connection for posttraumatic stress disorder (PTSD).

Service connection for an acquired psychiatric disorder other than PTSD.

A total disability rating based on individual unemployability due to service-connected disability (IU).

REASONS FOR REMAND

In the August 2018 remand, the Board of Veterans' Appeals (Board), in part, instructed the agency of original jurisdiction (AOJ) to obtain the Veteran's complete VA Vocational Rehabilitation file and associate it with the claims file. A review of the record does not reflect that the VA Vocational Rehabilitation file was sought or obtained. Therefore, another attempt should be made to associate those records with the file.

As part of the August 2018 remand, the Veteran underwent a VA psychiatric examination in August 2019. The examiner indicated that the Veteran was diagnosed with unspecified depressive disorder and unspecified anxiety disorder. Although the examiner stated that it was at least as likely as not that the psychiatric disorders had their onset during service, the explanation/rationale completely undercut the stated opinion.

Further, the examiner provided no opinion as to whether it was at least as likely as not that the diagnosed psychiatric disorders were the result of disease or injury in service, to include notations of disciplinary actions in service.



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Where the remand orders of the Board are not complied with, the Board errs as a matter of law when it fails to ensure compliance. *Stegall v. West*, 11 Vet. App. 268 (1998). Consequently, a remand is required.

The matters are REMANDED for the following action:

1. Obtain updated VA clinical records and associate them with the claims file.
2. Obtain the Veteran's complete VA Vocational Rehabilitation file and associate it with the claims file.
3. Return the claims file, to include a copy of this remand, to the August 2019 VA examiner, if available. If not available, the requested opinion should be provided by another clinician.

The clinician is asked to review the claims file, to include a copy of this remand, and provide the following opinion:

- Is it at least as likely as not that the Veteran's psychiatric disorders had their onset in service, or are otherwise the result of a disease or injury in service, to include notations of disciplinary actions in service?

All opinions expressed must be accompanied by a complete rationale.

4. If the clinician determines that an examination is necessary in order to provide the requested opinions, then one should be scheduled.

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Memo on Directed Development for Remand

Purpose: Misdirected Development

Mitigation For Missed Dev of VR&E

BVA remand directed development:

2. Obtain the Veteran's complete VA Vocational Rehabilitation file and associate it with the claims file.

Directed Error:

Please complete Directive #2. Once complete please send the claims file back to the examiner who provided the 03/30/2021 medical opinion for an addendum opinion. The VA examiner must state that they reviewed the c-file to include the records that were not available when they wrote their medical opinion on 03/30/2021 and state whether the evidence provided changes the previous opinion rendered. M21-5 7.G.4.a

Problem with this is SHARE shows these Federal records never existed (III.iii.1.C.2.i) since VR&E was never established this would be considered over development (Shoffner v Principi, M21-5 3.A.12.a, M21-4 6.A.a)

The Veteran is claiming service connection for Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD). Please examine the Veteran for a chronic disability related to his or her claimed condition and indicate the current level of severity.

If more than one mental disorder is diagnosed please comment on their relationship to one another and, if possible, please state which symptoms are attributed to each disorder. PTSD is claimed due to the following stressor(s): claimed stressors due to military duties and abuse during service

MEDICAL OPINION REQUESTED: Direct Service Connection

As per the Remand request:

Is it at least as likely as not that the Veteran's psychiatric disorders had their onset in service, or are otherwise the result of a disease or injury in service, to include notations of disciplinary actions in service?

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All opinions expressed must be accompanied by a complete rationale, CARSWELL BRITTANY B PH.D Psychology at QTC.

Clinician: If using the ACE process to complete the Medical Examination, please explain the basis for the decision not to examine the Veteran, and identify the specific materials reviewed to complete the Medical Examination.

The Veteran does not need to report for all examinations for the following Contention:

- Post Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD)

NOTE: Your (examiner) review of the record is NOT restricted to the evidence listed below. This list is provided in an effort to assist the examiner in locating potentially relevant evidence.

1. Complete Service treatment records
2. BVA Remand 01/06/2021 (TAB AA)
3. C&P Examinations 08/21/2019 (TAB AB, AC, AD)

As per the Remand requesting review and Return the claims file, to include a copy of the remand, to the August 2019 VA examiner [CARSWELL BRITTANY B PH.D Psychology at QTC], if available. If not available, the requested opinion should be provided by another clinician.
