Office of Administrative Review PACT Act Effective Dates Under Legacy Appeals and Higher-Level Reviews



Purpose

This tip sheet provides guidance and examples on effective dates for legacy appeals and Higher-Level Reviews (HLR) impacted by Public Law (P.L.) 117-168, Sergeant First Class Heath Robinson Honoring our Promise to Address Comprehensive Toxics Act of 2022 (PACT Act).

Tips

Use the following tips and the table below to assist in establishing the effective date when granting legacy appeals and HLRs under the PACT Act.

- PACT Act effective date is August 10, 2022 (date P.L. 117-168 signed into law)
- Ask yourself Was the claim pending on the effective date?
 - Both pre-PACT Act and PACT Act provisions could apply.

Undiagnosed illness/medically unexplained chronic multi-symptom illness (MUCMI) • Noncompensable • New location • No manifestation time limit	August 10, 2022; <u>38 C.F.R. § 3.114</u> applies	Gulf War Veteran, served in Egypt, claims chronic fatigue syndrome (CFS), evaluated at 0 percent; previously denied 5/10/2022 because not compensable. HLR received 10/6/2022 for CFS, still evaluated at 0 percent. • Effective date 8/10/2022 (cannot be earlier because the grant is under PACT Act)
Exposure to Burn Pits	August 10, 2022;	Gulf War Veteran, served in



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Important Reminders

- If granting service connection due to a toxic exposure under authority that predates PACT Act, such as direct service connection, then do not apply PACT Act effective date provisions.
- Do not apply <u>38 C.F.R. § 3.816</u> (*Nehmer*) to herbicide claims granted on a new PACT provision.
- Claims received or associated with an ITF may be eligible for a retroactive payment under <u>38 C.F.R. § 3.114.</u>
- This is meant to be a tip sheet only. Please make sure to review the entire claims file to determine the correct effective date.
