The Importance of Knowing VA Terminology	
VA terminology (i.e. abbreviations, acronyms, and initialisms) are regularly used in all PMC VSR jobs and tasks.	
It is important to know your audience when using VA terms.	
When used incorrectly, VA terms can cause confusion and misunderstanding, especially when used incorrectly with Veterans and claimants.

Examples of How to Use VA Terminology in Claimant Correspondence	
Correct way:	
We considered your expenses for Medicare Part B premium for both you and your spouse, which totaled \$2,517.00; however, your income for VA purposes is still greater than the allowable limit. We can consider only medical expenses that are more than \$842.00, which is 5% of \$16,851.00, the basic maximum annual pension rate.	
Incorrect way:	
We considered your expenses for Medicare Part B premium for both you and your spouse, which totaled \$2,517.00; however, your IVAP is still greater than the allowable limit. We can consider only UMEs that are more than \$842.00, which is 5% of \$16,851.00, the basic MAPR.
