
Topic	Description
Time Estimate:	1 hour
Purpose of the Lesson:	This lesson is part of the entry-level curriculum Core Course for PMC VSRs. The purpose of this lesson is to prepare PMC VSRs to apply liberalizing legislation for pension claims.



What Is Liberalizing Law?	DISPLAY slide
Definition of liberalizing law	4. "What Is Liberalizing Law?"
Retroactive benefits	PROVIDE trainees with the following definition of liberalizing law:
	A liberalizing law is any law that brings about a substantive change to the law, creating a new and different entitlement to a benefit.
	EXPLAIN that retroactive benefits can be authorized if the claimant had potential entitlement on the date the law/regulation became effective and entitlement continued through the effective date of the award.

Scenario—Potential Claim for Liberalizing Law An 82-year-old Veteran applied for VA pension benefits on July 3, 2016. The Veteran met all of the eligibility criteria and was granted nonservice-connected pension benefits effective July 3, 2016, payable August 1, 2016.	DISPLAY slide 5. "Scenario—Potential Claim for Liberalizing Law" EXPLAIN that this is an example of when you would apply liberalizing law because the Veteran would have met the presumptive criteria of age 65 continuously from September 17, 2001. The Veteran may be eligible for retroactive benefits up to one year prior to his date of claim. Therefore, you would be required to send a development letter in addition to the award grant requesting income and expense information for the liberalizing law period of July 3, 2015, through July 31, 2016. EMPHASIZE that the criteria for apply liberalizing law will be covered in greater detail later in the lesson.

Why Is Liberalizing Law Important?

Applies to:

- Cases involving pending or previously denied claims
- Original claims filed after the change in law or administrative issue

9. "Why Is Liberalizing Law Important?"



ASK why knowing when to apply liberalizing law is important. Select a few trainees for answers. Provide any additional information or clarification based on the answers received.



EMPHASIZE that it is rare that they will have to apply liberalizing law to a pending claim. In the event that a claim is pending, but all information for the period of one year prior is provided, you would award liberalizing legislation in addition to the original grant. In most cases, you will grant liberalizing legislation, then, develop for information.

	EXPLAIN that liberalizing law should be applied in the following situations:
	The Veteran is granted pension (presumptively).
	The Veteran met one of the presumptive requirements on the date of the law change (9/17/2001) through the present date of claim.
	The Veteran has never received pension.
	EXPLAIN that if a claim is received for

	liberalizing law, the claim must be received within one year from the date of the final action letter notifying the Veteran of potential entitlement to an earlier effective date. Additional development may be required.
	ASK if they have any questions regarding when to apply liberalizing law or how to award benefits once determining liberalizing law must be applied.

Partial Grants of Liberalizing Law	DISPLAY slide 11. "Partial Grants of Liberalizing Law"
When to grant partial liberalizing law	
Pension and Parents' DIC	REFER to manual reference M21-1 III.vi.8.1.b (Provisions of 38 CFR 3.114(a) on Eligibility for Retroactive Benefits) regarding partial grant of liberalizing law.
	EXPLAIN that partial liberalizing law can only be granted under the following conditions:
	If the claimant's net worth is a bar to benefits at the start of the liberalized period
	 If net worth is reduced and is no longer a bar at any time during the liberalized period, then benefits can be awarded for a partial retroactive payment.
	If the MAPR changes during the liberalized period which results in the IVAP being under the limit
	o The MAPR can change if a dependent is added to the award or SMP is granted. It does not include just a change in medical expenses without a change in MAPR. Under this circumstance, benefits can be awarded for a partial liberalizing law retroactive payment.

Scenario—Apply Partial Liberalizing Law	DISPLAY slide 12. "Apply Partial Liberalizing Law"
A Veteran applies for benefits July 3, 2016. The Veteran submits income, net worth, and medical expenses from July 3, 2015. The Veteran shows continuous entitlement from July 3, 2015; however, he receives an inheritance in May of 2016 that significantly reduces the original benefits. Depending on when this claim is worked, it may cause an overpayment or it may cause a retroactive payment. Future benefits would severely decrease.	EXPLAIN that this is an example of when you could apply liberalizing law, however, if it is clear that granting liberalizing legislation and counting the inheritance would be detrimental to the Veteran in both the net effect and future rate, you would not grant liberalizing legislation and would not count the inheritance.
